# **Interpretation of Domains:**

### Citizenship

This represents the quality of a tenant with respect to the rest of the building, including:

- · Interactions with other tenants
- · Keeping common areas clean
- Following rules and respecting quiet hours
- Attending and participating in community gatherings

# **Agreeableness of Tenant**

This represents the degree to which a tenant will cooperate with their landlord, including:

- Expressing themselves calmly and maintaining an even temper during disagreements
- Cooperating during repairs, viewings, etc.
- Reporting problems
- Honesty

# **Good Neighbor**

This represents the extent to which the tenant is likely to be a good neighbor, including:

- · Being polite and helpful with neighbors
- Avoiding making excessive noise during quiet hours
- · Containment or prevention or strong odors, such as from cooking

### Cleanliness

The extent to which a tenant is likely to maintain a clean residence, including:

- · Cleanliness of kitchen, bathrooms, and bedrooms
- Garbage treatment
- · General organization

#### **Hoarding**

This represents the risk of the tenant accumulating a sufficiently large quantity of clutter that the unit can no longer be safely used as a residence.

### **Timely Payments**

Extent to which tenant's rent payments are likely to be made in a timely and complete manner.

#### **Tenure**

This represents the extent to which the tenant is likely to remain in the unit for a longer duration.

## Respect for the Law

This represents how strongly the tenant avoids illicit or illegal activities, such as abuse of drugs and alcohol, theft, etc.

# **Respect for Property**

This represents the extent to which the tenant respects both their own property and the property of others. This includes potential damage to the unit or building.

### **Wastefulness**

The overall wastefulness of a tenant, including amount of garbage generated and waste of resources such as water, electricity, and natural gas.

#### **Unit Condition**

This represents risk associated with the tenant's behavior on vacating the unit, such as:

- Cleaning and removing trash
- · Removing all belongings
- Vacating by the deadline

### Vengefulness

This represents the extent to which a tenant is likely to seek revenge if evicted or if they feel mistreated. Note that even high-risk individuals are unlikely to seek revenge, due to the uncommon nature of these behaviors.
